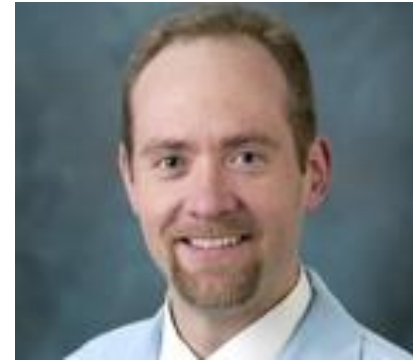

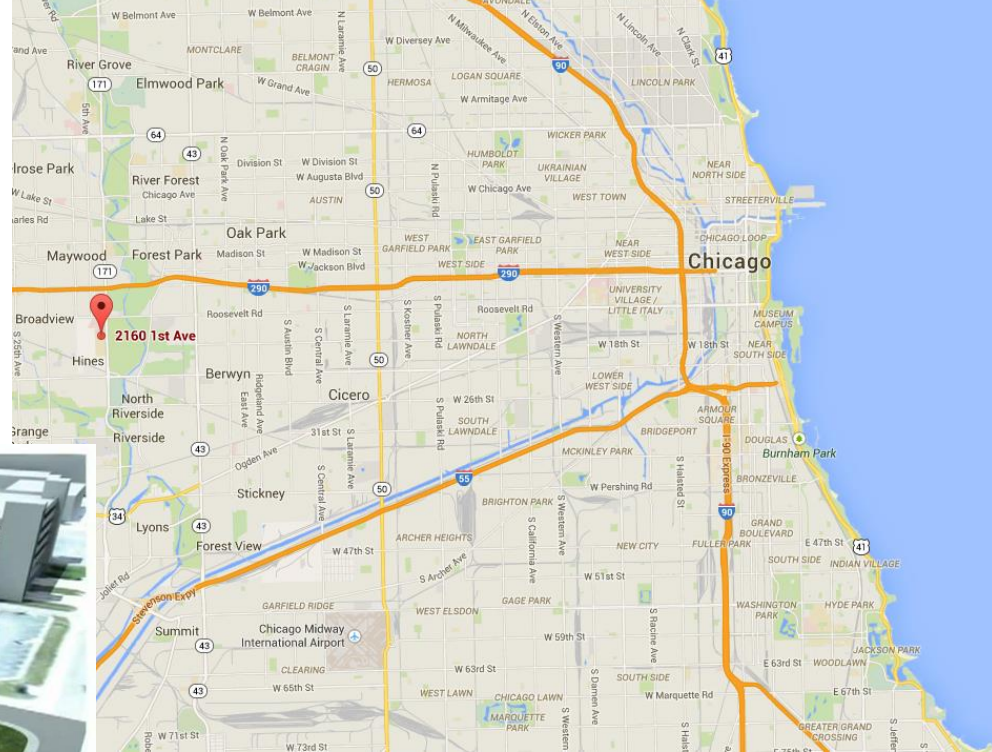

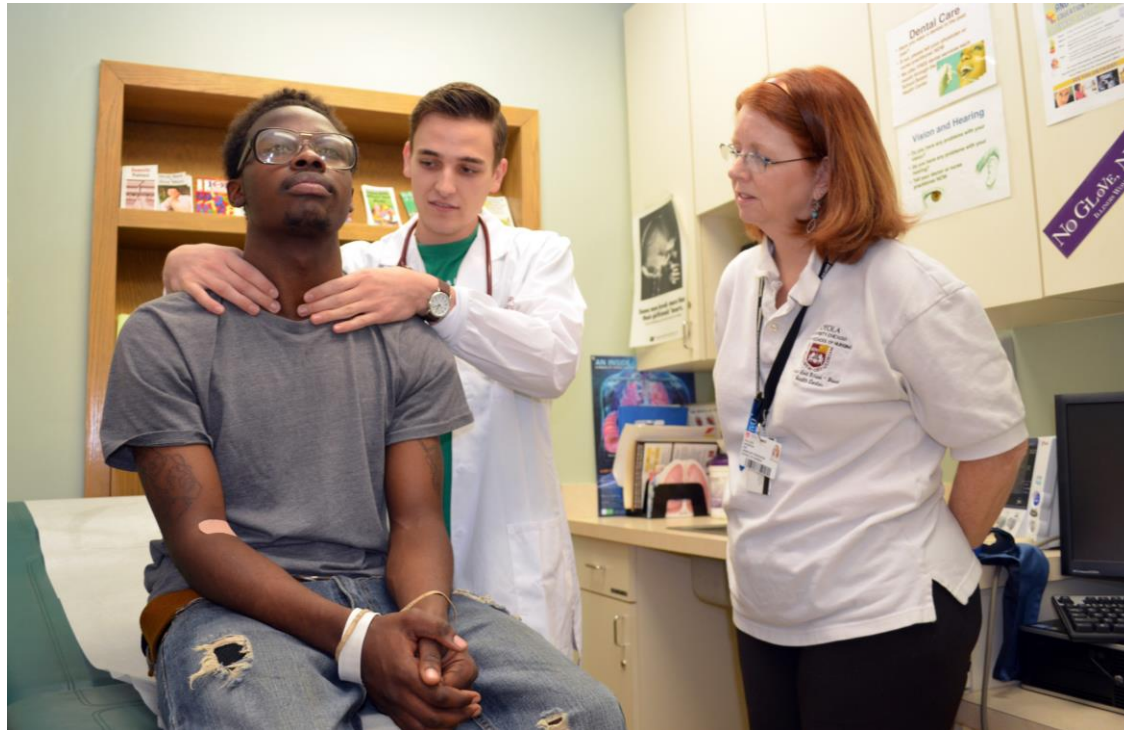

 - HRSA Grant: I-Care Path



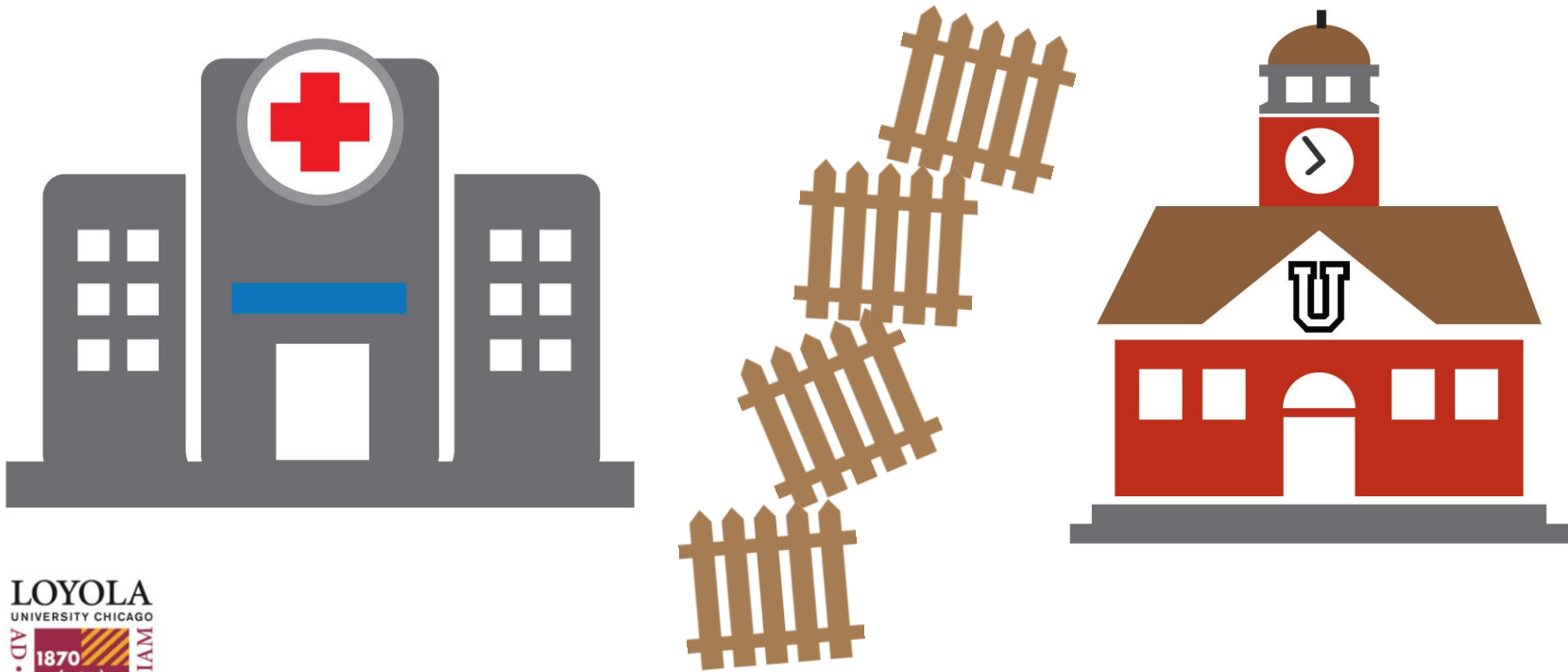
